



## #MMIRA2026 Global Conference **POSTER GUIDELINES**

The Poster session at the MMIRA 2026 Conference will provide greater opportunities to learn about each other's research and to practice communicating your research.

An academic research Poster is a visual representation of your research that stimulates ideas between the researcher and the audience. It is designed to convey a message quickly and efficiently. It should balance text and visual material, such as graphs, images, and tables.

If you are interested in submitting a Poster for consideration by the Conference Scientific Committee, please follow the instructions and deadlines below.

### **Poster Presentation:**

A Poster Session will be built into the Conference Program.

At the Poster session, you will be required to stand by your Poster so Conference participants can view your research and interact with you. You may wish to create a smaller version of your Poster as a handout with your contact details (including a QR code).

We encourage you to leave your poster on display for the duration of the entire conference, in a designated zone provided by the Conference Organising Team.

Before submitting your Poster, please carefully read and adhere to all the instructions in this guide.

### **Conference Proceedings**

Poster abstracts only will be published in the Conference proceedings.



## GUIDELINES

Posters provide a visual and concise way to share research, projects, or innovative practices and encourage informal discussion.

The Poster should explain your research clearly and succinctly.

The following guidelines may help you to structure your Poster.

**You will need to submit an Abstract in a Word document and the actual Poster.**

*A recommended Abstract template is provided below. Please remove the instructions provided in orange before your submission. Use 12 pt, 1.5-line spacing throughout.*

## POSTER

### Poster Format:

#### POSTER submission

- **Poster size:** A0 (841MM X 1189MM), PORTRAIT ORIENTATION, 3.5 cm Border
- Maximum word count of 800 words
- Font sizes should be legible from 2-3 metres with a minimum of 96 point for the main heading, 30 point for the subheadings and between 18-24 point for standard text. Typefaces such as Arial, Verdana, Tahoma and Times New Roman are easier to read.
- **Include:**
  - Title, author(s), affiliation(s)
  - Research question(s)
  - Methodology
  - Key findings or expected outcomes
  - Practical or theoretical implications
- **Design Tips:**
  - Use large fonts and minimal text (bullet points preferred).
  - Include visuals (charts, graphs, images) for clarity and engagement.
  - Ensure high contrast and readability from a distance.
  - Optional: Add a QR code linking to additional resources.
- **APA7 referencing:** We recommend referring to these hyperlinked editorial guidelines for details related to referencing
- **Language:** English only (British English or American spellings are acceptable, provided they are used consistently in the Poster.
- Submissions that do not meet these criteria will be rejected

### Submission:

If you wish to present your work at the Poster session, you must register and submit a digital JPEG or PowerPoint representation of your Poster.

If your Poster is accepted for display, you will be responsible for bringing the full-size PRINTED Poster to the conference.
